Courts

Please be aware:

Matches between 11:00 and 19:00 will be played primarily on the **grass courts** (weather and time permitting). All earlier/other matches will be played on either red artificial clay, green clay or potentially on indoor hard courts.

The Northern's grass courts have been rated *second only to wimbledon*, so this is a real treat we're excited to share with you this year.



Footwear

You may play on a range of surfaces depending on weather and time constraints.

Players are encouraged to wear appropriate sports shoes for the courts they are playing on. Grass court shoes with pimples are suggested for the grass, but all court shoes are allowed on the grass courts at *The Northern*.



The Tennis Venue

As one of the premier tennis clubs in the North of England it is a real honor to be able to host our 12th tournament at ***The Northern Lawn Tennis Club.***

Situated in the heart of Didsbury, South Manchester, ***The Northern*** is a unique members-owned Racquet sports and Fitness club.

Founded in 1881 it has one of the richest histories of any sports club in the world. Over the years it has hosted many international tournaments including the Manchester Open, and the current Manchester Trophy which is part of the ATP Challenger Tour.

The courts you will be playing on have been graced with athletes such as Jimmy Connors, Billy Jean King, John McEnroe, Martina Navratilova, Sue Barker, Goran Ivanisovic, and Martina Hingis.

Pete Sampras won his first ever grass court tournament at ***The Northern***, and more recent stars of the circuit such as Anna Ivanovic have used the club as a training base.



Facilities

The club has restringing, fitness, and sports therapy facilities that GLTA players will be able to enjoy during the tournament.

The bar is open 9am-11pm serving hot and cold drinks. Food is served 11am - 8pm

Transport around Manchester

Airport

Manchester Airport is the third largest airport in the UK and offers excellent connections to the city centre and beyond with a regional railway station and Metrolink station onsite. A taxi from the airport to the venue should cost between £15 and £20.

Low Cost airlines such as Easyjet and Ryan air offer regular services from all over Europe and more than 200 worldwide destinations.

Road

Manchester is well connected to the rest of the UK via excellent motorway links. The M60 ring road connects the city to motorways north, south east and west. Parking is available at the venue.

Traveling around the city and suburbs Bus/Train & Tram

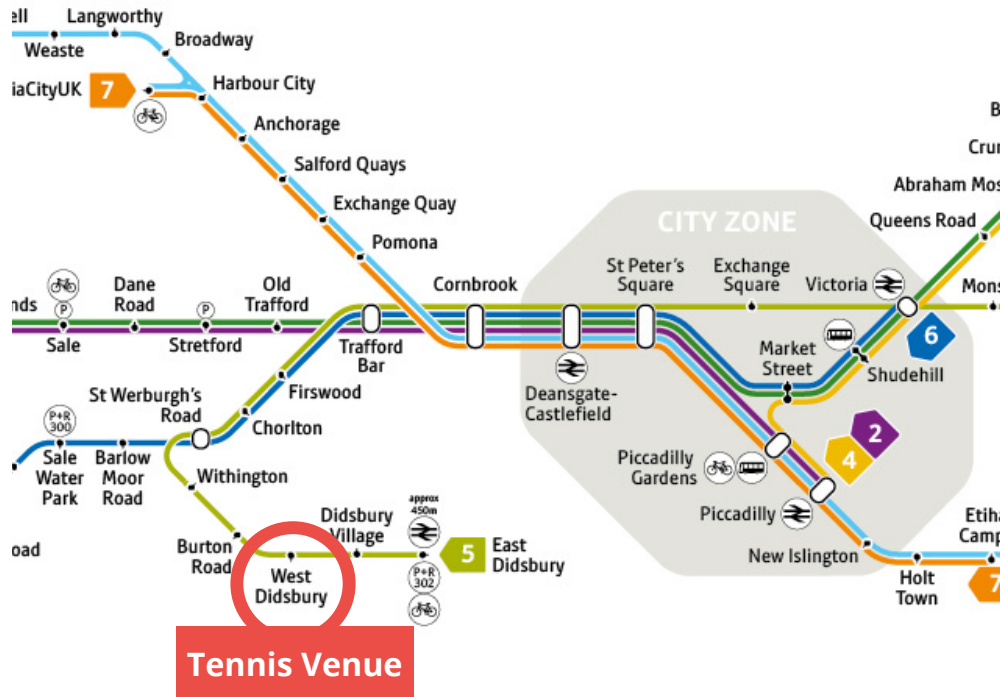
- **Tram or Bus** 30-40 mins

Tournament Regulations

This tournament will be played in accordance with the rules of the Gay & Lesbian Tennis Association (GLTA) and the International Tennis Federation (ITF). Tennis rules from the International Tennis Federation apply. These rules are described in the following pages.

By participating in Manchester's International Tournament "Kiss My Ace" players agree with these tournament rules.

In the event a situation arises which does not pertain to any of these rules, the tournament organisation will decide how best to resolve the situation.

Matches

- Please report to the tournament desk 30 minutes prior to each match (or when the venue opens).
- All main draw matches will be the **best of 3 sets with a normal tiebreak at 6-6 in the first 2 sets, and the 3rd set taking the form of a super tie break game to 10 points.**
- Some events could be played in round robins. For every match you win, you get 2 points. The player with most points is the winner of the round robin. When two or more players have an equal number of points, the head-to-head result counts. If scores are tied, the tournament organisation will count the relative match-points, then the relative set difference, then the relative game difference, then the number of sets won, then the number of games won. If scores are still tied, the winner will be decided by a toss.
- **Warm up times are limited to 5 minutes.**
- Report the match results to the tournament desk after the match.
- Between matches a 30-minute break is allowed after a main draw singles match and a 15-minute break after a doubles match.
- Organisers and volunteers are present to check balls, warm-up times, rest periods and to be of general assistance.

Late arrival

Late arrivals will incur a penalty in accordance with the GLTA rules starting from the moment the match has been announced (and a court is available). Therefore it is your responsibility to arrange transportation, get directions if necessary and leave yourself sufficient time to get to the venue.

- **Up to 5 minutes** loss of toss and 1 game
- **5 to 10 minutes means** loss of toss and 2 games
- **10 to 15 minutes** loss of toss and 3 games
- **More than 15 minutes** default

Balls and courts

- The balls will be used for a maximum of 3 matches.
- New balls will also be provided for each final.
- After each match balls must be returned to the tournament desk.
- **For singles matches always use the single posts.**
- Some matches may be played on an artificial or indoor surface due to court availability.
- Consolation matches will be played on artificial surfaces apart from the finals (where possible).

Attire

- Proper tennis attire (including shoes) is required when on court.
- **For finals day we'd like to encourage people to wear whites if possible.**

Do's and Don'ts

- Always enter the courts through the appropriate entrance. Avoid disturbing other matches.
- Players shall not engage in unsporting conduct or disturb other players.
- A player is not allowed to receive coaching during a match.
- Do not enlist the aid of spectators in making line calls.
- Wait until players on another court have completed a point before retrieving or returning a ball.
- Proper attire - we request whites for finals day if possible.
- **Players and spectators must not bring additional seats onto the grass.**

Unforeseen delay

In case of an unforeseen delay (including rain), the tournament organisation may opt for one or more of the following:

- Shorten matches by playing sudden death at deuce, receivers choice. However, in mixed doubles, the server must automatically serve to the same gender (as per ITF rules).
- Sets will be shortened first to 4 games with a tie break to 5 at 3-3.

The tournament organisation decides which option will be played. This will be announced prior to the match.



Our picks of manchester

The Village

What trip to the Manchester GLTA Tournament would be complete without heading to The Village?

The beating heart of LGBTQ+ Manchester, centred around the world famous Canal Street, the Village has something for everyone: be it cheap drinks and cheap pop in Thompsons or G-A-Y; cocktails for the ladies only at Vanilla; some cheeky leather or rubber fun in Eagle or REM; a classy glass at Velvet Bar; or a cracking bite to eat in No1 Canal Street!

Didsbury/West Didsbury area

Probably the best places for casual dining and socialising near the venue is Burton Road - there are numerous small restaurants and bars all of which offer something different, are friendly and casual, and none of which are ridiculously expensive.

Volta and Crazy Wendy's are a couple of our favourites on Burton Road but for our vegetarians and vegans there is also a great place called Greens on Lapwing Lane which is just around the corner.

Chorlton-cum-Hardy

This is another accessible suburb of Manchester and not far from the venue. As well as the bars and restaurants near the main tram stop, favourites near here are Elektrik Bar, and Jasmine or Turkish Delight for food (both bring your own alcohol).

You can also pay a visit to the lovely Unicorn cooperative grocery store on Albany Road, or walk the short distance to Whalley Range to visit the lesbian owned Nip and Tiddle on upper Chorlton Road.

Check out **Chorlton (Beech Road)** and **Chorlton (best of the rest)**.

Other areas that you might want to check out when you are visiting the city - lots of independent shops, opportunities for coffee, food and people watching, as well as a pint or two of craft ale and some great food.

Our commitment to Sustainability

You may already be aware that the bee is the symbol both of Manchester and also of our tournament.

This year in order to do our part to promote a more sustainable and environmentally friendly tournament, we are making the following efforts:

1. We will have drinking water available to players and recommend that everyone brings a water bottle to refill. The water in Manchester is drinkable.
2. We will be using local suppliers for all of our supplies for the tournament. This enables us to cut down on mileage and carbon footprints, as well as supporting our local economy.
3. We will be using electronic communications and as little paper as possible during the tournament and its preparation.
4. We will be recycling materials already purchased and utilised for previous tournaments and events to decorate the venue.
5. We will be donating funds raised from your generous donations at entry and from our fantastic raffle to The Proud Trust who are a charity supporting young LGBTQ+ people in our area. We thank you, on their behalf, for your generosity!
6. We will be recycling every ball used during the tournament through the Venues recycling scheme - so please ensure that you bring balls back to the desk.
7. Any left over food and goodie bag items, where appropriate will be distributed to local food banks, charities and tennis clubs.
8. We would like to encourage all participants to use public transport or to share journeys during the tournament to minimise the environmental impact that travelling to the event causes. Respectfully we would ask that anyone flying to the event looks at how they might offset the carbon emissions from their flight.
9. We can only be sustainable as an event if we respect the rules of the venue, playing on grass as a natural surface is in itself an environmentally friendly surface. Help us and the venue to respect this experience by not taking chairs onto the grass courts and by wearing shoes that do not cut up the courts.
10. We may be fortunate to have free flowing drinking water and constant electricity (at least for the time being) in Manchester, but always be mindful of leaving taps running and where not movement detecting lights are in place, if you switch it on when you go in, please make sure that you switch it off when leaving.
